


The Brain Research Institute's

NeuroCamp 2016 at UCLA



Synopsis:

NeuroCamp is a FREE BRI outreach program that brings together a group of 15-20 highly motivated high school students in a centralized lab setting. Students learn the fundamentals of neuroscience and basic lab techniques in Molecular Neurobiology, Neurophysiology and Neuroanatomy. NeuroCamp 2016 will be held over a two-week period (on the Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday of each week), on **June 13, 14, 16, and June 20, 21, 23**. Each day, NeuroCamp will meet from **1:00 – 4:00pm** with some overnight homework as needed. The overall goal of the program is to provide an exciting and rewarding introduction to research in neuroscience to a broad range of high school students from the Los Angeles area. Ultimately, we want NeuroCamp 2016 to stimulate their interest in college and an educational path leading to careers in science.
